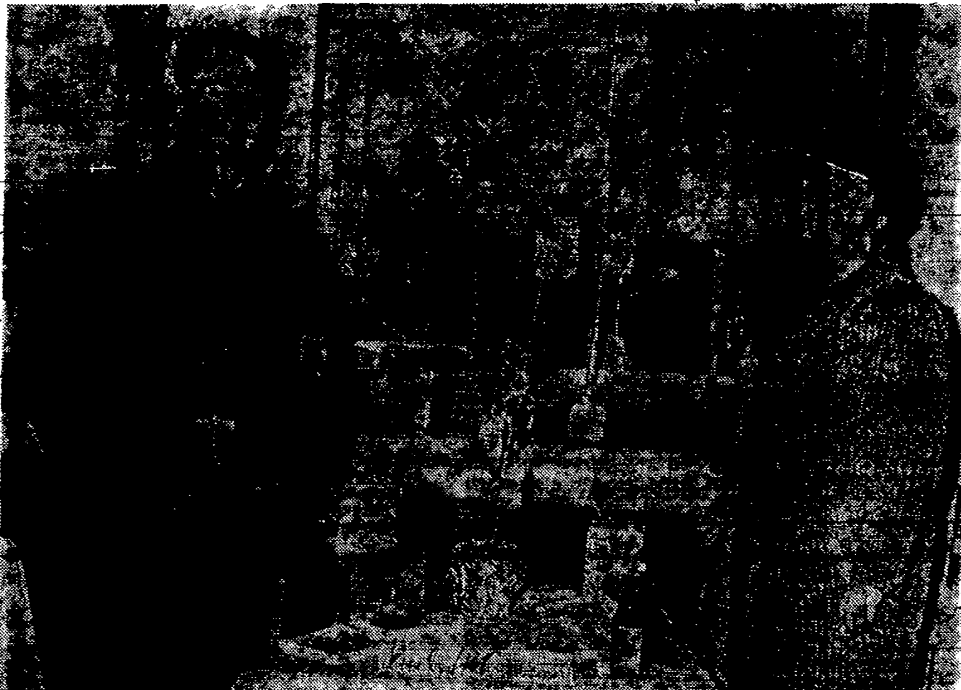
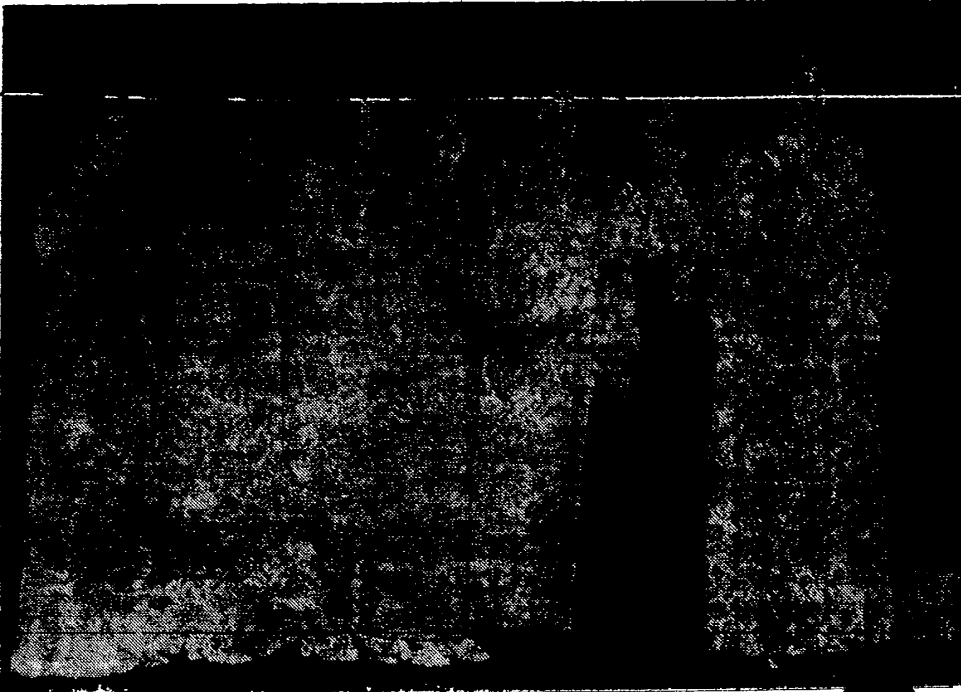


Maple Festival A Huge Success!

Andover Lions Easter Egg Hunt Sunday, April 15

The Annual Easter Egg Hunt, sponsored by the Andover Lions Club and the local Market Basket Store will be held Sunday, April 15th at 2:00 p. m. Sharp! The starting place of the event will be at the Parking Lot of the Andover Central School and will then cover the entire playground and ball diamond.

Village Board Holds Budget Hearing

The Budget Hearing was held at the Village Office Tuesday evening, April 10, 1973 with the following present, James Bliss, Mayor; William Dunham, Michael Brace, Avery Mead and Ronald Glover, Trustees.

The Budget Hearing was opened at 8:00 p. m., and after no person or persons appeared to be heard, the following resolution was offered by Ronald Glover and seconded by Avery Mead, who moved its adoption and it was duly carried.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JUNE 1, 1973 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1974. MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF VILLAGE GOVERNMENT AND ESTABLISHING THE RATES OF COMPENSATION FOR OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES FOR SUCH PERIOD.

WHEREAS, This Board of Trustees has met at the time and place specified in the notice of Public Hearing on the tentative budget, and no person appeared to be heard thereon; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the tentative budget as published, and as hereinafter set forth and a copy attached to these minutes, is hereby adopted, and that the several amounts stated in the budget be, and they hereby are appropriated for the objects and purposes specified and the salaries and wages stated in such budget shall be and are hereby fixed at the amounts shown there in effective June 1, 1973.

This resolution adopted by the following votes: Avery Mead — Aye, Ronald Glover — Aye, William Dunham — Aye, Michael Brace — Aye and James Bliss — Aye. Carried.

This concluded the business of this meeting and the Mayor declared the meeting adjourned.
