Minutes of the organization meeting held April 2 were read and approved on a motion made by Ronald Glover and seconded by Michael Brace. Carried.

William Dunham moved, seconded by Avery Mead, to authorize Robert Costello, to purchase a new chain saw to be used in the General, Water and Electric Departments. Carried.

### School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, April 9, 1973 by the President, Mr. Carl Atwell. The following Board members and Mr. Welbezahl were present: Conner Stephens, Francis Horan, William Walker and Mrs. Slade.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting were read for approval. Francis Horan made the motion that these be accepted. Seconded by Mary K. Slade. Carried by 5 yes votes.

The Treasurer's Report was read for approval and comparison. Carl Atwell made the motion that these be accepted as read. Seconded by Conner Stephens. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Francis Horan and seconded by Mary K. Slade that the interest of \$583.10 received on Savings Certificates be deposited in another Savings Certificate. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Mary K. Slade that the refund transfers as presented be made. These totaled \$119.34. Conner Stephens seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

General Fund bills for March 1973 for \$2,928.66 were presented for approval. Carl Atwell made the motion that these be approved for payment and Mary K. Slade seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

School Lunch bills for \$2,432.36 were presented for payment. Francis Horan made the motion and William Walker seconded that these be paid. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Food Recovery bills for \$242.80 were presented for payment. William Walker made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Title II bills for \$62.15 were approved for payment. Mary K. Slade made the motion and Francis Horan seconded. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Conner Stephens report was read for approval. A bill of \$12.65 for the month of March. A motion was made by Francis Horan to file this report with the minutes. Seconded by William Walker. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

The Gross Payrolls were read for the approval of the Board. The total was \$42,781.62. Carl Atwell made the motion to accept these as read and Francis Horan seconded the motion. Carried by 5 votes of yes.

William Walker moved Carl Atwell seconded that the F. H. A. girls and Miss Goodrich be allowed an extra day for their trip to Detroit. Carl Atwell moved and Francis Horan seconded, passed by 5 votes of yes.

The School Calendar was adopted by 5 yes votes. Carl Atwell moved, Francis Horan seconded School will begin Tuesday P. M. September 4, 1973.

Principal Harold Welbezahl was approved to attend ACSJ meeting

April 29 to May 1 at the Concord Hotel. Francis Horan moved, William Walker seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

Carol Marsh was approved for Tenure as an Elementary Teacher. Francis Horan moved and Carl Atwell seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

Gwen Boyce was also approved for Tenure. Mrs. Boyce was approved for tenure as an Elementary Teacher. Francis Horan made the motion and Conner Stephens seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.
