Veterans News

Thousands of wives and children of veterans and servicemen are failing to take advantage of benefits and programs provided them according to James J. McLaughlin State Veteran Counselor.

Educational benefits for wives, widows and children of veterans whose total permanent disabilities, or deaths, were service-connected was cited by the veterans counselor as one example of the many benefits available. Also eligible for educational benefits are wives and children of servicemen missing in action (MIA) or prisoners of war (POW) for more than 90 days. VA loans are available to wives of POWS and MIAS and to unmarried widows of veterans and servicemen whose deaths were service-connected.

Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) is paid by VA to widows and children if the veteran's death was service-connected. Pension is paid if death was non-service-connected. In certain cases, parents may be eligible for DIC checks. Still another benefit, an additional monthly aid and attendance payment of \$55 is paid to eligible wives, widows and parents who are patients in nursing homes, helpless or blind, or so nearly helpless or blind that regular assistance from another person is required.

Most benefits for dependents and survivors of veterans are based on at least 90 days of military service. For Vietnam Era veterans, at least 181 days in service is required for GI home loans and educational benefits entitlement.

Full details of these and other benefits for dependents and survivors of veterans and servicemen are available at the local counseling center of the New York State Division of Veterans' Affairs located at the Municipal Bldg., in Wellsville, N. Y., on Tuesdays, and at the City Bldg., 108 Broadway, on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.



MATCHING THE HATCH

Emerging just in time for the good flyfishing season for trout in New York State, is a handy little streamside guide that takes much of the mystery out of "matching the hatch". It is entitled Compara-hatch, and was brought to my attention by the Cortland Line Co., the flyfishing people.

Just like most everything else these days, flyfishing, and especially dry flyfishing, has gotten complicated somewhere along the line. It started out very simply — you watched and waited until you spotted a feeding trout. Then you determined what it was feeding on, tried to match it with an artificial fly, and then attempted to make the fly perform naturally in the water over the active fish. Often the best possible time to catch trout was in the midst of a swarm or hatching mayflies — hence the age-old challenge of "matching the hatch".

Now, that doesn't sound too difficult, does it?

Ah, but you have underestimated mind of man. Those two or three simple actions have been elaborated into volumes, even scores of volumes. Men have devoted their lives to the pursuit — the aquatic biology of certain insects, the equipment (flies alone can be a full-time specialty, let alone the leaders, lines, rods and reels), the techniques of casting, the keeping of journals.

All this has been done, of course, for fun, to pursue the ultimate in a given sport. But the vast traditions, lore, and language of flyfishing for trout tend to scare off beginners.

This is where the two little booklets of Compara-hatch come to the rescue. Prepared by authors Alfred N. Caucci and Robert Nastasi, one pocket-sized booklet covers the major species of mayflies in considerable detail. Emergence charts are provided showing specific dates for Southern New York and the Catskills, and for the Adirondacks and Northern New England. It tells all about the three stages of each species — nymph, dun, and spinner — revealing where they are usually found in the stream and their actions that anglers must duplicate.

The companion booklet is on tough, waterproof paper and displays color photographs of the various stages of mayflies and appropriate flies to match them. This is the part you can carry in your fishing vest or tackle bag, and refer to when you are on the stream.

This concept is startling to anyone who has tried to get a handle on the subject of dry flyfishing for trout. It has taken about 100 years of experience and put it in your hip pocket — Cortland Lines and the authors are to be congratulated!
