A \$100,000 repair and renovation project for Greenwood Central School building was approved by a vote of 34 - 8 at a Special District Election Monday night. The project includes repairs to the school building, roof, windows walk, and other work. The election was preceded by a District Meeting chaired by Mrs. Patricia Higgins, Vice-President of the Board of Education. The District is expected to receive about 80 per cent of the project cost in State Aid. The remaining 20 per cent is expected to be financed from \$12,000 placed in a repair reserve fund and \$8,000 from the growth and formula as calculated by the State Auditing Department.

Named To Dean's List

Area residents are among the record 747 students named to the winter quarter Dean's List for the Alfred campus of State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred.
