Starts Monday, May 14

Poppies Have A Twofold Purpose

In Flanders Field the Poppies blow between the crosses row on row

These first words of a famous poem penned by Col. John McCrae, a gallant Canadian soldier who died in 1918 later joined those he wrote of during World War I ever since have inspired soldiers and civilians of all nations to regard red poppies as symbols of those who died in defense of their country.

Now 55 years later poppies are blooming again in the willing hands of patients at Veterans Hospitals to be distributed by area American Legion Auxilliary Units.

The First Poppy was worn in America on November 9, 1918 in New York. The First Poppies were silk flowers made in France by widows and orphans of French soldiers. In October 1921, the poppy was adopted as its official Memorial Flower by the American Legion Auxilliary during its first National Convention in Kansas City, Mo. In 1922 the first American poppies were crafted by patients in veterans hospitals in Minnesota. Crepe paper was selected as the best material because it cost little and is extremely flexible and durable.

This handwork provides hours of occupational therapy for men and women in the hospitals: All materials used are donated by the American Legion Auxilliary which pays each veteran for the poppies they make.

This pay is important to veterans. Money earned helps buy certain things not provided by the hospital or saved for when they leave the hospital. Each completed bag of poppies is \$15.00. Some veterans can earn as much as \$165 a month. Most important is the way of making poppies improves muscular coordination. The poppy project realizes money for the Christmas project, summer hot dog roasts, 52 weekly popcorn parties and other monthly parties in the hospital recreation rooms.
