Miss Betty York of Washington, D. C., flew into Elmira Saturday to spend the week-end with her

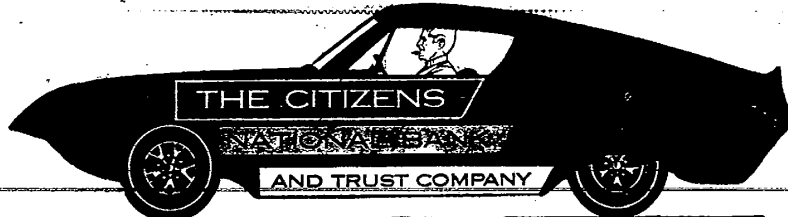
