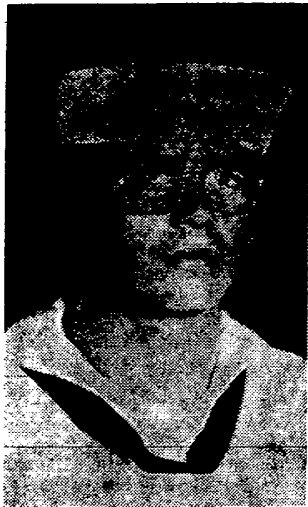

Registrations are now being accepted for summer camp for 5th thru 12th graders and '73 graduates of the Andover Central School. 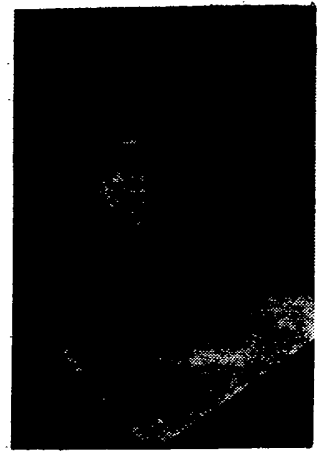
George Milligan and Amy MacMichael were recent winners in a Sunday School contest and each will receive an extra dollar toward their camping fund.
