**Physical Science Workshop Slated For Area Teachers**

Olean, N. Y. — A workshop in Introductory Physical Science (IPS) for junior high school science teachers of Western New York is planned for a two-week period, August 20 - 24 and August 27 - 31, in the Olean Jr-Sr High School. Dr. Charles Coffey, head of the District's Science Dept., announced.

Six such workshops will be conducted throughout the State during August by Prentice-Hall, Inc., at no cost to participating school districts or to enrollees. The Olean workshop was designed to accommodate interested teachers of Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Allegany Counties; southern Erie, Wyoming, Livingston and Ontario Counties; eastern Steuben County and the Pennsylvania Counties of McKean, Potter and Cameron. Dr. Coffey said.

Dr. Jack Glenzer, instructor of early secondary and secondary science methods, Dept. of Education, State University at Fredonia, will conduct the Olean workshop with supplies and texts provided by Prentice-Hall. Area science teachers interested in registering for the workshop may do so until Wednesday, June 13, by writing or calling Dr. Charles Coffey, 410 W. Sullivan St., Olean, N. The IPS workshop consists of 10 pre-school days and five meetings planned for Saturdays during the fall of 1973. The sessions run from 8:30 A. M. to 3:30 P. M. Dr. Coffey, program coordinator, said IPS is a lab-oriented approach to the teaching of physical science. It is taught nation-wide and in U. S. Army and Navy Department Schools as well as in 13 foreign countries, Prentice-Hall claims.
