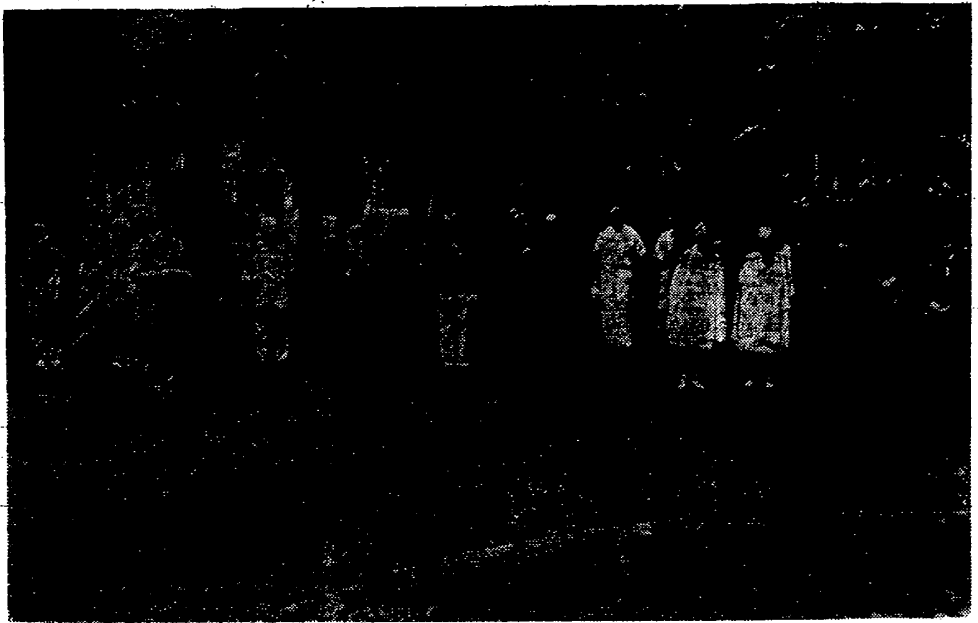
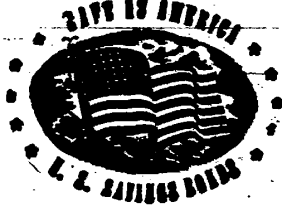
Clark H. Potter, 73, of Friendship, May 26. His widow, a son, a daughter, three grandchildren, three sisters and a brother survive.

**Senator James L. Buckley Named "Man of the Year"**

Washington — U. S. Senator James L. Buckley has been named "Man of the Year" for the State of New York by the National Federation of Independent Business, the world's largest business organization.

Wilson S. Johnson, President of NFIB, said Senator Buckley had been selected to receive the award because of his "outstanding efforts on behalf of the independent businessmen in New York and in the Nation."

Senator Buckley, in ceremonies in his Washington office was presented a handsome engraved plaque mounted on walnut and shaped in the form of New York.

"The small independent businessman," Senator Buckley said, "has been the major cornerstone of the country's economy throughout our history. Today, as in days past, independent businesses continue to contribute both valuable and necessary strength and flexibility to the economic fibre and well being of the United States and its citizens."

The National Federation of Independent Business, which looks after the interests of small independent business has more than 344,000 member-affiliated firms across the United States, employing some 2.6 million persons, and producing in excess of \$48 billion annually.

In Senator Buckley's home state the Federation has more than 22,300 member firms, which employ some 141,000 people and contribute more than \$1.3 billion annually to the economy of New York.

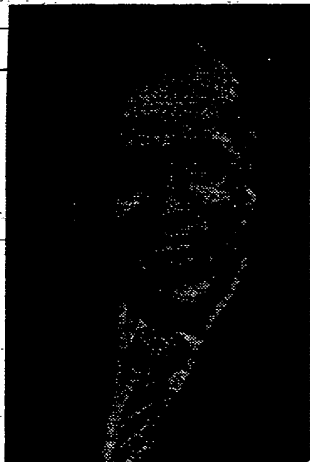
