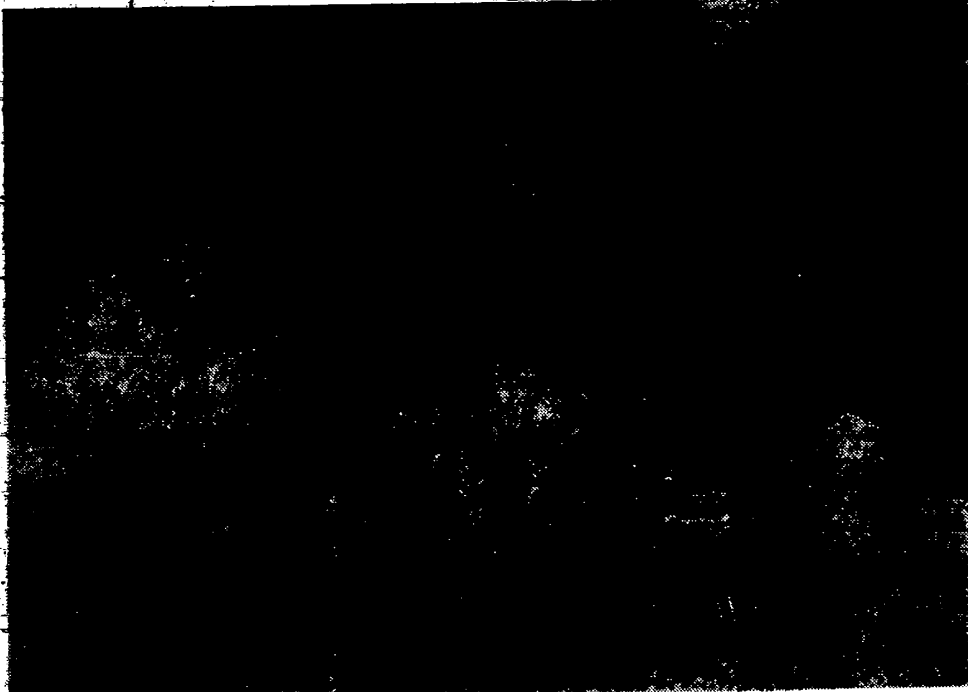

Lions Club Holds "Lazy Eye Clinic"

The Andover Lions Club held their 2nd annual "Lazy Eye Clinic" Saturday morning, June 2nd, at the ACS Cafeteria with 18 children tested ending up with two referrals.

Amblyopia, commonly called "Lazy Eye" is a rather common functional eye disorder in young children. With this condition, one eye sees sharply and the other sees poorly. In many cases this problem can be corrected if detected and treated before the child reaches school age.

The problem of "Lazy Eye" WILL NOT correct itself, and once the child reaches school age, the chances for correcting the problem are greatly reduced.

Andover Lions Members that participated in the conduct of the clinic were: Dick York, Tom Smith, Donald Thorp, Joe Cregan, Red Allen and Jim Bliss, Chairman of the Lions Club Sight Conservation Committee.

Mrs. Joanne Cameron, Allegany County Public Health Nurse Service, supervised the "Lazy Eye Clinic" and records of the results were turned over to this service for future reference.

A.C.S. Sports Banquet June 12

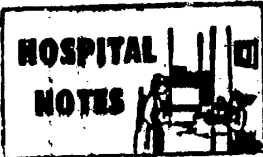
The fourth Annual Andover Central School Sports Banquet will be held Tuesday evening, June 12 at 6:30 p. m. in the school cafeteria.
