

Planning Conference To Be Held June 30th

Belmont June 6 — Alfred State College's Campus Activities Building is to be the site of the June 30th Planning Conference being sponsored by the Board of Legislators of Allegany County.

Board Chairman Herland Hale today ~~presented~~ detailed information on the conference's organization and purposes. He indicated that the Legislators were becoming increasingly concerned about the need for more contact between government bodies within the County as a result of expanding local government responsibilities under new Federal and State programs. Of particular concern also is the accelerating pace of change that is expected to accompany opening of the Southern Tier Expressway within the next couple of years.

The day-long conference is the most comprehensive of its kind ever held in the County, and it is thought to be an innovation for planning activities in the Southern Tier. Participants will have the opportunity to hear from Federal and State officials on such problems of local interest as water and sewer, land use controls, revenue sharing, other funding programs, and organization of local planning functions. At the same time, there will be ample time devoted to small group discussions where participants will be able to discuss among themselves and with visiting officials, problems of greatest local interest.

The tone of the meeting will be set by general remarks from an official of the New York State Office of Local Government, and a representative of the National Association of Counties in Washington D. C. Other speakers — at the luncheon and later in the day — will include a representative of the New York State County Officers Association and possibly a national political figure.

The 500 invitees include all members of town and village boards and planning boards as well as school boards and officials from Allegany County, along with County Legislators and department heads. Officials of State and Federal agencies located in the County will be invited, and political and planning officials from neighboring counties will also be invited.

Specific discussion topics to be covered will include:

- 1) Organizing for Planning — County and Local Levels
- 2) Experiences of Other Communities Along Highway Corridors
- 3) Environmental Issues
- 4) Economic Development
- 5) Impact on Educational Systems
- 6) Community Renewal and Development

Participants will have an opportunity to attend discussions on approximately three of the above topics.

Veterans News

LISTEN VETERAN
PUBLIC LAW 92-540 — provides that an advance educational assistance allowance may be paid to most veterans studying under the GI Bill at the beginning of a school enrollment period that begins on or after August 1, 1973. The advance payment will be for the month or part of a month in which the enrollment period will begin plus the allowance for the next succeeding month. The check will be made payable to the eligible veteran or person and mailed to the school for delivery upon registration, but not more than 30 days before the course is to commence. Veterans and eligible persons who will be attending on a less than one-half time basis will not be eligible for an advance payment.

GI BILL DEADLINE — May 31, 1974 is the expiration date for educational benefits for most post-Korean War Veterans — Unless the veterans begin training soon, they could lose part or all of their benefits. The deadline affects servicemen discharged between January 31, 1955 and June 1, 1968. Benefits for those veterans were not authorized until enactment of the current GI Bill on June 1, 1966, thus, they must complete training within eight years of release or by May 31, 1974 deadline, whichever

is later. The deadline does not apply to veterans interested in flight training, apprenticeship or on-the-job and farm cooperative training. In these areas the deadline is August 30, 1975, or eight years after discharge, whichever is later, to complete training.

COMPLETE INFORMATION — counseling and assistance on all veterans benefits is available at the local counseling center of the New York State Division of Veterans' Affairs located at the Municipal Building, Wellsville, N. Y., on Tuesdays, and at the City Building, 108 Broadway, Hornell, N. Y., on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.


