Local Craftsman To Exhibit In Craft Fair 8

Taking their individually designed and handcrafted articles, local craftsmen will join some 500 colleagues at Craft Fair 8, the largest exposition of crafts in the country.

Set for June 29 through July 1 at the Dutchess County Fairgrounds in Rhinebeck, N. Y., this Fair is sponsored by the Northeast Region of the American Crafts Council.

Arele Zimmerman of Andover, a popular exhibitor of last year's Fair will display her attractive collection of stoneware pottery and Raku at the Fair. The technique of Raku has been learned from Japanese potters, who were the first to experiment with it, and involves firing the pottery very quickly while it is still wet or just glazed. This gives a special earthy quality to the pieces, quite unlike the more conventional stoneware.
