New State Law Helps Blind Persons

New State law now in effect requires that blind persons using a metallic or white cane be given the right of way when crossing a street or highway, according to Charles C. Taylor, chairman of the State Commission for the Visually Handicapped.

Mr. Taylor said the same right of way must be given to a blind cane, or accompanied by a guide dog.

"Under previous legislation," said Chairman Taylor, "blind persons had to be carryn their canes in a raised or extended position. Now they merely have to be using a cane, or accompanied by a guide
