Publication of said plan, in addition to a subsequent actual use of funds report, is required by the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972. which authorized revenue sharing. sharing.

General revenue sharing is a \$30.2 billion, five year program which returns a portion of federal taxes to state and local governments. The unique feature of the program is that it allows state and local officials to decide how

their jurisdiction's funds are to be spent within broad federal guidelines.
