Work consisting of grading, cleaning, patching, black topping and curb installation of Baker Street and Church Street, in the Village of Andover, New York.

Upon acceptance of his bid, the successful bidder shall execute a contract in accordance with his proposal and furnish a suitable security bond in the sum of the amount of the contract conditioned for the faithful and prompt performance and completion of the work specified in the contract; if he neglects or refuses to execute said contract and furnish said bonds, the deposit heretofore mentioned of 10% of the list price, shall be forfeited and retained by the Village of Andover, New York as liquidated damages.

The contract will contain a provision that every mechanic, laborer and workman employed in or about the work contemplated by the contract shall be paid not less than the prevailing rate of wages and provided with not less than the prevailing supplement which are set forth in the specifications a copy which may be obtained as aforesaid.
