Assemblyman James Emery, representative of the 136th Assembly District, and Deputy Majority Leader of the State's Assembly, hosted the dinner and conference held at the Cameo Restaurant in Wellsville with representatives of local weeklies and area daily newspapers attending.

Assemblyman Emery fielded questions on a wide range of topics, including legislator's pay, zoning, aid to private schools, sewer aid, law enforcement, a proposed Transportation Bond Issue and mass transportation to include assistance to the hard pressed Railway Systems.

At the close of the press conference which lasted several hours, press representatives agreed that it had been a highly productive meeting and Assemblyman Emery indicated that he would like to make such a get-together an annual affair.

Topics of the group meetings were: 1. Organizing for Planning — County and Local Level; 2. Experiences of Other Communities Along Highway Corridors; 3. Environmental Issues; 4. Economic Development; 5. Impact on Educational Systems; 6. Community Renewal and Development.

The group meeting on the Educational System drew the largest
