Greenwood Central School District voters approved a \$637,767 budget for the 1973-74 school year at the annual District election Tuesday by a vote of 127 - 70. There were seven blank votes.

At a budget hearing last week there was some sentiment expressed for a budget defeat but there was no dissent voiced at the annual meeting Tuesday which followed the voting from Noon to 8:00 P. M. There were about 40 persons present for the meeting which was chaired by former school superintendent Virgil Hussey. A resolution calling for \$6,000 to be raised towards the purchase of a \$12000 school bus in the 1974-75 school year was adopted by a vote of 152 - 45 with seven blank votes. The Trustee post was won by John Hunt who raised 116 votes to 28 for Irene Edwards and 55 for James Feenaughtv. Mr. Feenaughty carried most of the discussion about he budget at the hearing. Mr. Hunt will succeed Clair Austin who did not seek re-election.
