The groom's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Orville Johnston, attended the wedding.

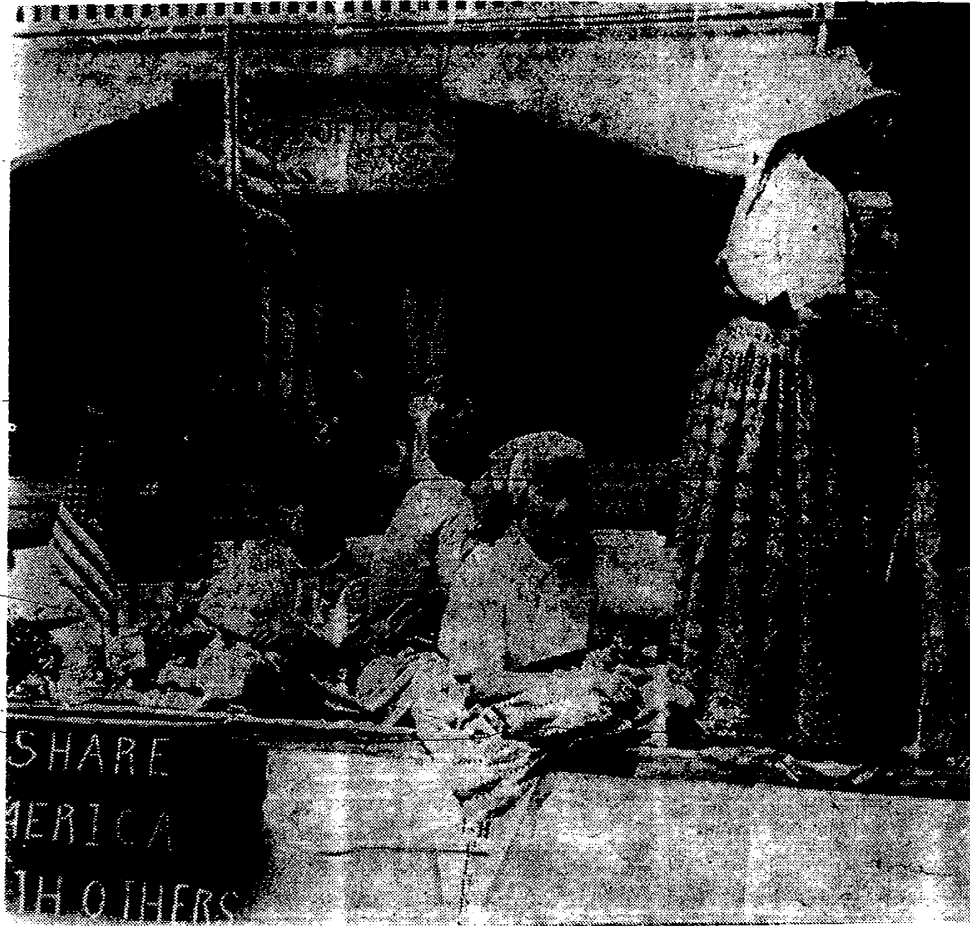
After the ceremony the couple was honored at a small reception in their home, given by Mrs. Marcia Key.
