

Holland - Perry Speedway News

Holland, New York — Holland International Speedway and Perry Motor Speedways are in the midst of their mid-season championship events for the 1973 racing season. H. I. S. has scheduled Saturday evening, July 21st as its Late Model Sportsman mid-season championship event, and P.M.S. has slated the following evening, Sunday, July 22nd as its Limited Sportsman mid-season championship event plus Genesee "Double Point" night for the drivers.

The 50 lap NACASAR Late Model Sportsman contest at Holland International on Saturday evening will add fuel to the hotly contested NASCAR track and state point championships which are up for grabs at this point in the chase. The defending champion at Holland International Speedway is West Seneca's Art Clark, who is hot on the heels of Eggertsville's Dick Flaig, Perry Motor Speedway's defending track champion at this moment. Both these point leaders are pressured strongly from another former champion, Stroker McGurk from North Collins, N. Y. This precarious event always provides fans with the closest of keen competition and exciting finishes.

Sunday, July 22nd, P. M. S. has scheduled its Limited Sportsman mid-season 30 lap championship, plus a Genesee "Double Point" night for the Late Model Sportsman division. Dick Miller of Stafford, N. Y., continues as odds on favorite to capture the Limited Sportsman event, to add to his already leading high point total for his division. Miller's strongest competition should be from two steady competitors, Doug Hewitt and Paul Weber, who follow Miller in the point standings. Similar strong competition should come from Orchard Park's Jim Remery and John Carpenter of Angola. However, with Charging Charlie Pangrazio of Elba, N. Y., back in his old coupe, he also has to be considered a strong title competitor.

The popular mystery mileage car contest continues to roll along with 40 weekly winners at both speedways, with a monthly \$100 prize winner. Each time you are a weekly winner, it enhances your chances to become a monthly winner which also lowers the odds for you to drive off with a beautiful Dodge convertible after the season's completion in September.

An added deserving treat for these hot summer months will be the Kodak Park Athletic Association Auto Racing Boosters Club (KPAAB) challenge to the "beer belly guzzler" fans in a "drink till you drop" Beer drinking contest. Incidentally, this contest will take place near the completion of the race card so the contestants may enjoy the evening's auto racing.

NASCAR Late Model Sportsman, Chargers and Limited Sportsman class cars are featured at all competitive events at USA tracks.

Holland International Speedway is less than a 35 minute drive from downtown Buffalo, with action beginning at 8 p. m.

Perry Motor Speedway, a beautiful, temperable drive south of Rochester, begins competition each and every Sunday evening at 7 p. m.

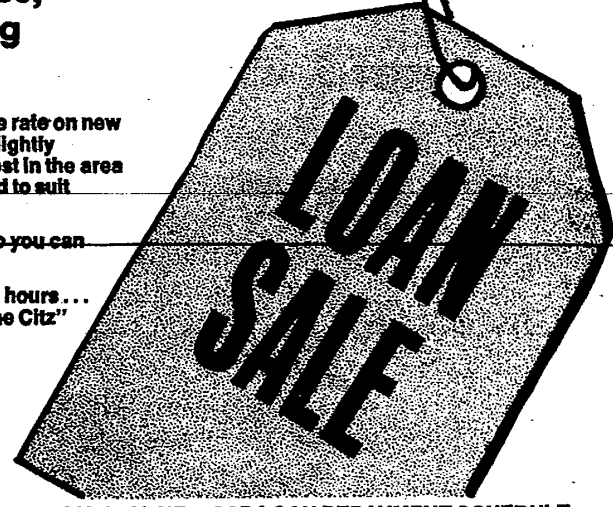
