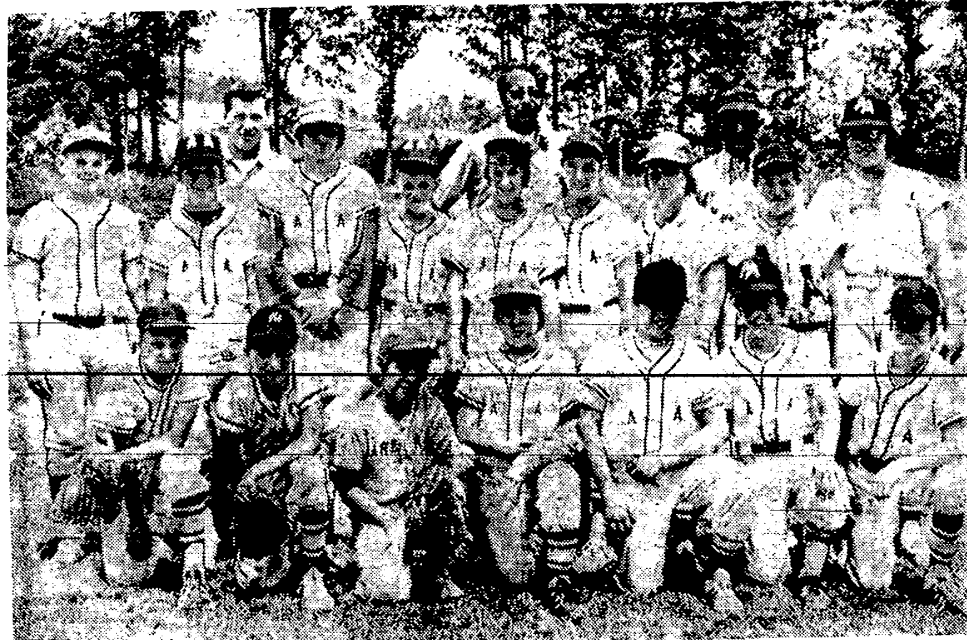

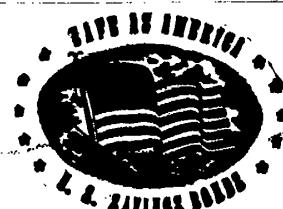
Andover wound up with a 7 and 5 record good for 2nd Place in the League.
