

## Holland - Perry Speedway News

Holland, N. Y. — The United Speedway Associates, Inc., tracks of Holland International and Perry Motor Speedways have succeeded in running seven complete race cards in succession for the 1973 stock car racing season. When one looks back to the consecutive rain-out period that ran through the first half of the racing season, the latest completion record looms an unmountable feat.

Saturday evening, July 28th, will be a three star NASCAR race card at Holland International Speedway. Since the mid-season championships are completed at the 3/8 mile banked oval, NASCAR competitors in the three division settle down for their final stretch drive for the track championships, plus the prestigious state championships.

Current N. Y. S. leaders in the NASCAR Late Model Sportsman divisions at both tracks are perennial winners Dick Flaig of Eggersville and West Seneca's Art Clark. In the hotly contested NASCAR Limited Sportsman division, multi-feature winner Dick Miller of Stafford, N. Y., continues his battle with John Carpenter of Pt. Breeze and Orchard Park's Jim Remery.

In the Charger division, race fans have never before seen such a see-saw, up and down battle for the year ending championship title. Defending champion Steve Hill of East Aurora continues his winning ways, but not without new ending pressure from rookie driver Gail Barber of Bliss, N. Y. These two "hot shoes" must both beat out the "hard charging" Bobby Thomas of Silver Spring, N. Y.

On this week's agenda for Perry Speedway, kick off action will begin on Saturday, July 28th at the annual "Sea-Serpent Festival" parade with two race cars from each division plus the P. M. S. race cars in attendance.
