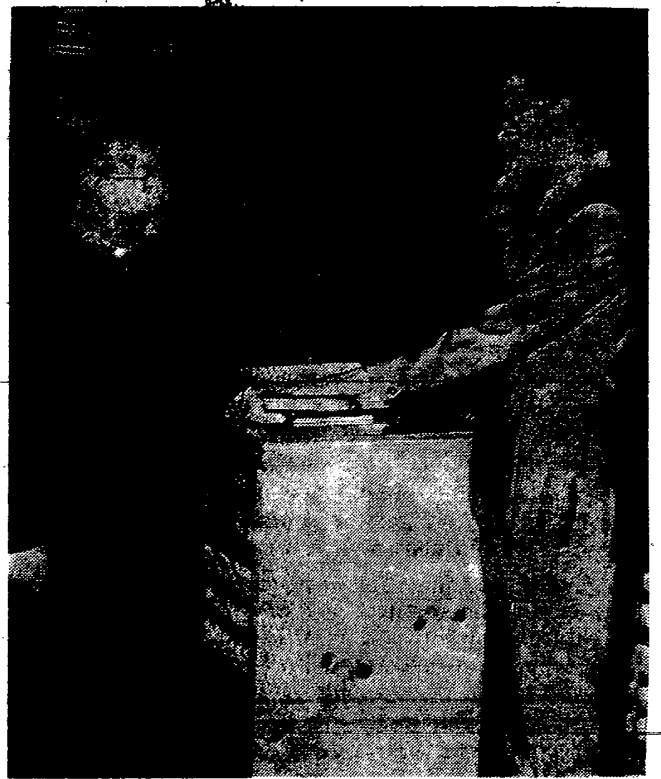

Iroquois Tel. Co. Breaks Ground For New Building

The Iroquois Telephone Co., a member of Continental System, broke ground Tuesday afternoon for a new building on Greenwood St., in back of the Citizens National Bank & Trust Co.

The new building will be constructed of brick with a masonry on 3 sides down 6 feet from the roof and will be 22 feet by 38 feet in size and will cost approximately \$60,000.

Plans call for the completion of the new building by the end of the year which will house about 150 to 200 thousand dollars of new and additional equipment which will improve the local Telephone Service.
