

## Holland - Perry Speedway News

Holland, New York — Ron Bennett of Holland International Speedway and Ed Serwacki, Promotor of Perry Motor Speedway, have been working diligently for the past several weeks in a concentrated effort to bring a nationally known NASCAR Grand National Star here to the United States. The week of negotiating have finally jelled and it appears former Daytona International Speedway winner Caleb Yarborough will be at Holland International Speedway on Saturday evening, August 18th, 1973.

William Caleb Yarborough was born March 27, 1939. The 5' 7" 185 lb. Timminsville, South Carolina resident and his wife, Betty Jo, have one daughter, Julie Anne. Yarborough returned to NASCAR racing in 1972 following a 2 year respite with the United States Auto Club (USAC). Yarborough, who campaigns the Kar Kare Chevrolet maintained by Junior Johnson this season, was not overly active in NASCAR Winston cup in 1972, but in late season races he showed that the talent that made him one of stock car racing most exciting personalities still remain. In 1968, Yarborough drove the Wood Brothers Mercury to a record four super speedway wins to earn \$136,786. Although in 1970 he had only three wins, his total earnings were \$115,875. He has finished first 14 times in Grand National racing out of a career of 198 starts with his biggest win purse \$47,250 for the 1968 Daytona 500.

If you are an avid race fan you must mark down August 18th at Holland International Speedway as one of the highlights in your racing events. Yarborough will in competition in a local competitive car against our stars in cars in a special 50 lap test. With the powerful arms Yarborough has built up through his racing endeavors, he should be in good shape to sign autographs for his many admirers.

Sunday evening, at Perry Motor Speedway, Ed Serwacki has slated the 1.3 mile action oval as K.P.A.A. Night. This is a tribute evening to the fine efforts of the Kodak Athletic Association has put forth for the benefit of all auto-racing. K.P.A.A. members displaying their membership cards will be admitted to the Speedway free of charge.

The NASCAR competition evening has also been slated as V.A. Hospital night. All out patients from the Bailey Avenue, Buffalo, New York Hospital are invited by Promotor Serwacki, if their doctor permits providing the USA Government red tape can be conquered.

Finals for the Junior Starter contest will be declared at Holland International Speedway, Saturday August 18th. 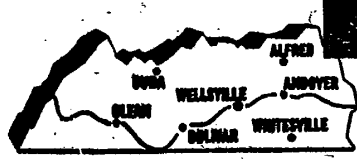
