American Legion Post Service Officers are reminded that GI Bill education and training benefits for thousands of Viet-Tim and post-Korean War Veterans will expire May 31, 1974. Most education benefits for those discharged prior to June 1, 1966, will expire on May 31, 1974, the eighth anniversary of PL 89-358. However, this expiration date does not affect the GI Bill on-the-job, farm cooperative, apprentice, or flight training benefits for these veterans.

## Doctor Shortage Action Pledged

Assembly Deputy Majority Leader James L. Emery has revealed that he has received assurances from Governor Rockefeller that the problem of doctor shortages in many areas of the State would be given attention in the Governor's legislative program for 1974.

Emery (R-Geneseo) had written the Governor earlier this month urging that he take action to halt the blockage of qualified students into private and public medical schools in the State in light of the increasingly critical doctor shortage in rural areas.

This week he received a reply to that letter from Dr. T. Norman Hurd, secretary to the Governor, expressing the Governor's concern over the doctor shortage problem. The Hurd letter stated in part:

"As you know, during the summer we will be working on the Governor's legislative program for the next session. I assure you that we will address ourselves to this problem and will work closely with you in seeking solutions —"

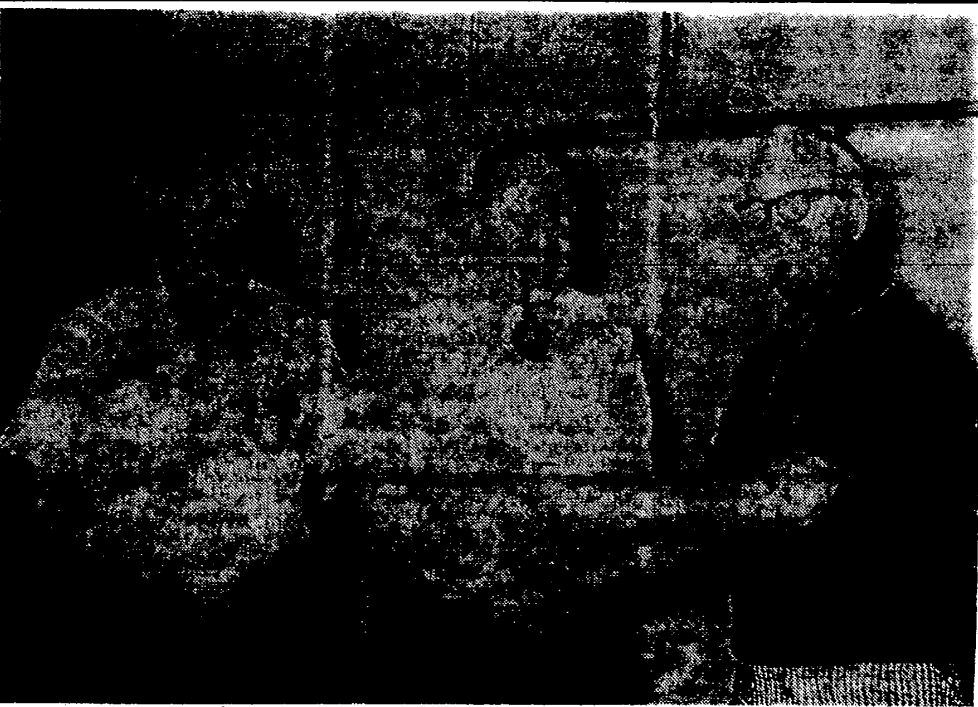
"I am gratified at the Governor's prompt response," the Geneseo lawmaker said, "and I sincerely hope that he will make this a priority item for his 1974 legislative program."
