**Free Well Child  
Clinics Te Begin In  
Allegany County**

Mrs. Margaret D. Connelly, Director of Patient Services for the Allegany County Public Health Nursing Service announces the beginning of free Well Child Clinics in Allegany County for infants and children up to school age. These clinics are designed to pro-

vide regular health assessment for the growing child to detect early, any abnormalities or problems so they can be treated promptly. Screening tests include vision, hearing, speech development testing, blood tests for anemia, urine tests for sugar and protein, as well as observation of the child's growth pattern. The child can also receive immunizations required for school entrance. Any deviations from normal or illnesses are referred to the family's personal physician for diagnosis and treatment.

The Clinic will be staffed by public health nurses and a pediatric nurse practitioner, Mrs. Gail May, Medical Advisor to the new service is Dr. Joseph Longo of Cuba, New York who will be available by telephone as a consultant to the nursing staff during clinic hours.

For convenience the clinics will utilize the Mobile Health Unit and will be held in four different villages one day each month on a regular basis. Starting dates are for Caneadea on Monday, August 27th and Richburg on Wednesday, August 29th. In September the clinics will add Angelica and Whitesville to complete their schedule. Attendance is by appointment which can be made by calling the Angelica office of the Nursing Service 466-7694.
