**Organ Recital Open To Public**

Houghton College Division of Fine Arts presents its division chairman, Dr. Charles H. Finney, F.A.G.O. in a faculty organ recital Wednesday, September 12, 1973 at 7:30 p. m. in Wesley Chapel Auditorium. Open to the public, this is the college's first cultural presentation of the 1973-1974 school year.

Designed to exhibit the breadth of tone color of the 3153 pipe Holtkamp organ, the program consists of 10 selections by classical and contemporary masters. Principal works include Bach's "Tocatta and Fugue in D Minor", Handel's "Air" from "Concerto XII for Strings", and "Tocatta" from Daniel Pinkham's "Revelations." Dr. Finney will perform one of his own compositions, "Brevity for Reeds on 'O Worship Thy King'" and "Aus Tiefer Not" composed by Dr. William T. Allen, Houghton College Professor of Piano and Theory.

Dr. Finney, a fellow of the American Guild of Organists since 1942, received his Ph. D. from Eastman School of Music, Rochester, N. Y. While on sabbatical leave last year, he did post-doctoral study at Eastman and worked on a new Wesleyan Church Hymnal. Aside from his duties at the college he has distinguished himself as a composer, arranger organist, and has concertized in many states.
