Houghton College Division of Fine Arts presents its division chairman, Dr. Charles H. Finney. F.A.G.O. in a faculty organ recital Wednesday, September 12, 1973, at 7:30 p. m. in Wesley Chapel Auditorium. Open to the public, this is the college's first cultural presentation of the 1973-1974 school year.

Designed to exhibit the breadth of tone color of the 3153 pipe Holt-kamp organ, the program consists of 10 selections by classical and contemporary masters. Principal works include Bach's "Toccata and Fugue in D Minor", Handel's "Air" from "Concerto XII for Strings", and "Toccáta" from Daniel Pinkham's "Revelations." Dr. Finney will perform one of his own compositions, "Brevity for Reeds on 'O Worship Thy King'" and "Aus Tiefer Not" composed by Dr. William T. Allen, Houghton College Professor of Piano and Th ory.
