Dig Root Crops After Frost

If you are planning to store carrots, beets, and turnips for winter use, don't dig them too early; wait until heavy frosts occur.

A Cornell University vegetable crops specialist advises the gardener to leave these crops in the garden until it gets quite cold.

Prof Ray Sheldrake at the N.Y. State College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Cornell, says that these crops should be stored in the coolest place in the home for use in mid-winter if you do not have a good cellar for storage.

Cover them with sand to reduce shrinkage and, at the same time, to keep them from getting too warm.

Pumpkins and winter squash to be stored should not be picked too early either; wait until a light frost hits the garden.

The best place to store them is in a warm dry spot during the initial two weeks to set the skins and heal any scratches, and then keep them in a cool, dry place. "They'll keep well in a cellar and you can enjoy them through the winter", Sheldrake says.
