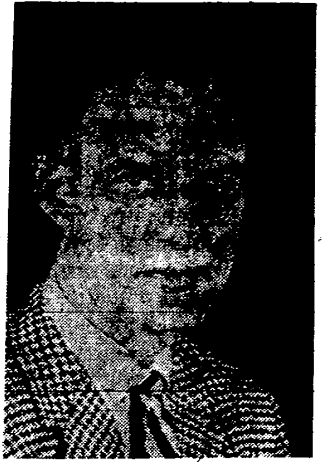

Donald F. Jones Accepts Position In Morrisville

Donald F. Jones, chairman of the Wellsville Vocational Division of State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred, has resigned to accept a position in Morrisville.
Professor Jones, who has held the Wellsville Division since his inception in 1966, will become chairman of the Division of Agriculture at State University Agricultural and Technical College at Morrisville. He will leave the Wellsville post in January.

Professor Jones, a member of the Alfred State College faculty for 18 years, will be returning to his one-time home town where he lives in the Morrisville area.
Both he and his wife were raised in the Oneida area and they still have relatives there as well as a summer camp on Oneida Lake.
"We have always spent part of our summers at our cottage, and both of us have many ties with the Oneida area," Professor Jones said. "This was the factor which influenced our decision to take the job in Morrisville."

Before becoming chairman of the Wellsville Division in 1966 Professor Jones was professor of agronomy in the Division of Agriculture on the Alfred campus. He also was acting chairman of the division from 1960 to 1962.
He joined the Alfred faculty in 1955 as an instructor and ten years later was promoted to full professor.
A native of Oneida, he is a graduate of Oneida High School and is married to the former Johanna E. White of Oneida Valley.
Dr. David H. Huntington, college president, said a search committee will be formed to recommend a successor to Professor Jones. The committee will be headed by Dr. George Morgenfeld, dean of instruction.
The Wellsville Vocational Division of Alfred State College was established in 1966 as a pilot program for high school graduates who desired and showed an aptitude for skill training of a vocational nature.

This year the American National Red Cross has changed their Red Cross Standard and Advanced First Aid Courses.

Mrs. Sally Thornton, First Aid Instructor Trainer for Allegany County went to Canandaigua Lake, September 14, 15, and 16 where she received retraining as a first aid instructor trainer.

The Standard First Aid and Emergency Care course will require no less than 14 hours to complete compared to the present 10 hours. The Advanced First Aid and Emergency course is designed to meet the needs of individuals and groups who provide first aid and emergency care frequently.
