

Girl Scout News

The Southern Tier Girl Scout Council has mobilized its Field Organization and staff to implement the new, fully computerized registration system of the Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. New equipment at National Headquarters in New York City now scans the registration forms and takes off the information directly. Each registered girl and adult receives an identification number and retains this number throughout her entire Girl Scout career. Leaders now do not have to make out the complete registration forms — after this year of conversion, they will merely make changes in the pre-printed form, and add new girls and adults.

The new system will enable the local and national organization to reach each girl and adult directly with information, and to set up specialized programs. It will make the transfer of girls from one council to another in the United States much easier, and it will eliminate the staggered-month system of registration geographic areas. Henceforth, all girls will register in September.

Nearly 4,000 girls and adults in Steuben and Allegany Counties will be receiving their identification cards during the next few months. In order to process the registrations with accuracy and ease, the council has set up registration nights in various school areas at which new girls may be registered by their parents. Direct parent-to-leader registration is a necessary part of the system. Leaders will later attend Registration Clinics with Council Field Committee members and staff to process the troop registrations.

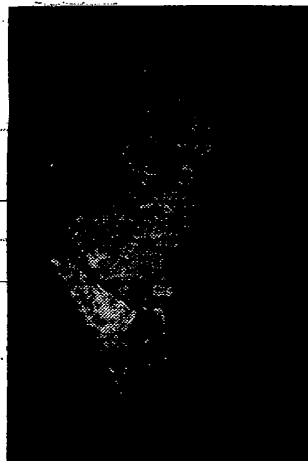
