Walter H. Harris

Walter H. Harris of Elm Street, Andover, died at the St. James Mercy Hospital, Hornell on Tuesday, October 30, 1973 following a long illness.

He had resided in Andover the last nine years. He was born October 26, 1896 in Buffalo, a son of William and Mariaret Honahan Harris. He had also lived in Albany, Rochester and Teaneck, N. J.

He was a Marine Superintendent for the New York Central Rail Road, retiring Nov. 1, 1961. Upon retirement, acted as consultant to the Tri-State Transportation Commission in New York City.

He was a member of the Andover Chamber of Commerce, the Knights of Columbus, Teaneck, N. J.; New York Rail Road Club of New York City; Vanderbilt Y.M.C.A., New York City; the Andover American Legion; and the Andover Town Planning Board. He was also a veteran of World War I.

Survivors include his widow Camilla; three daughters, Miss Joyce Harris of Andover; Mrs. Robert (Anne) Haughton of Wilton, Conn.; Mrs. James (Mary) Duncan of Rockaway, N. J.; nine grandchildren; several nieces and nephews.

Friends may call Wednesday and Thursday from 2 - 4 and 7 - 9 p. m., at the James B. Mulholland Funeral Home, Andover. Rosary services will be held both evenings at 8:30 p. m. There will be a 9:30 a. m. Friday Prayer Service at the funeral home, followed by a 10 a. m. Mass of the Resurrection at the Blessed Sacrament Church in Andover with the Rev. Joseph Fiore, officiating.

Burial will be in Gate of Heaven Cemetery, Andover.

He has openly and publicly taken a stand against The Transportation Bond Issue and stated: "It is an example of fiscal irresponsibility." "To issue bonds for capital construction is one thing — but, to issue bonds for operating revenue to maintain a 35c Bus and Subway fare in New York City is fiscal irresponsibility."

On the widely discussed proposed County Office Building, "Jerry" has stated: "The Voters must not be denied the right to vote, at a Public Referendum, to either approve or disapprove a new County Office Building after an intelligent estimate of the cost has been made public." "In my opinion, we must not increase our County Debt — without the approval of the Taxpayers."

Both of these proposals would cost we Taxpayers "a bundle of tax \$ dollars" — and continue to — for a long, long time!
