

Lee Ryan Reports From Allegany County Legislature

At the conclusion of the solid waste study, we made our recommendations to the governing boards of both counties, which were mainly:

1. That we adopt a district system of sanitary landfills (Five landfills in the two county area).

2. Each county would go it alone with the exception of district three, eastern Allegany and western Steuben, where it was felt by our committee that it would be advantageous to work together and share a single landfill.

3. That the outlying areas those farthest from a landfill site, be served by a container type box that would be dumped automatically by truck. It was recommended that a large number of these be used.

4. That each county be responsible for the disposal and that it be by sanitary landfill. The containers would be considered part of disposal.

5. That each county appoint a solid waste advisory committee to carry on the detailed planning that is necessary to qualify for State funds.

Allegany County appointed this committee and I was made chairman. Our first act was to contract with Donald MacFarquhar, a professional engineer, to be our consultant and check out in detail the landfills that were recommended in the original study.

We are now about ready to undertake a pilot project with the "Clean and Green" containers. We feel that with so many of them recommended in the study and this being a new idea in our area, we would like to give a trial test for about nine months. This way we

would expand very few dollars and get some information which will help us determine how worthwhile it would be.

The main purpose of the advisory committee is to explore the recommendations of the Allegany-Steuben study in detail and then recommend to the Board of Legislators what we feel is the best method of implementation.

None of the Committee members at this point has any set way of accomplishing this; but I feel sure that with the consultants lead, whatever plan we eventually recommend, it will be able to encompass other methods of disposal other than just landfill.

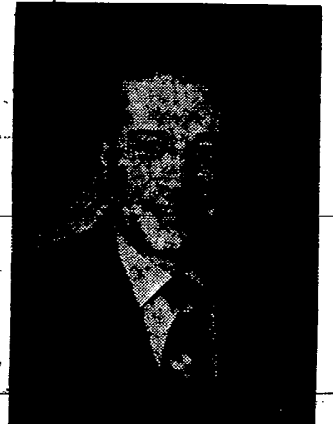
