

Town Of Andover Candidate Loses Legislator Bid

Gerald McCartney, Legislature Candidate for District V, lost out on his bid to represent the Town of Andover and the rest of District 5 in Tuesday's Election.

As a result of the election, the Town of Andover and the Town of Alfred, two of the largest in the 5th District, will have no direct representation as they had during the days of Town Supervisors. Instead, they will be represented by the three elected Legislators, Lee Ryan, (D), from Almond; Robert McNinch, (R), from Belmont; and Leonard Watson, (R), from West Almond.

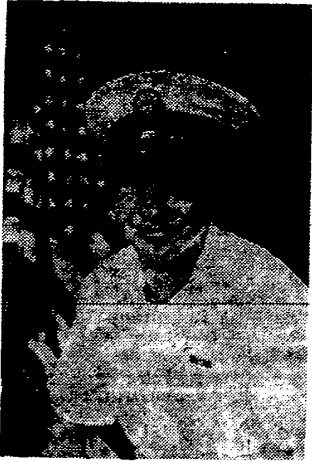

"Hal" Weibezahl To Leave ACS In Early December

The Andover Board of Education announced today that Supervising Principal Harold Weibezahl will leave early in December to assume the District Principalship of the South Seneca School District. Mr. Weibezahl has been Principal of Andover since July of 1971.

The South Seneca School District is located between Cavuga and Seneca Lakes and includes the villages of Interlaken, Ovid Willard and Lodi. It has a population of about 1700 students who attend two elementary schools, a middle school and a high school. Plans are under way for a four million dollar building program, which will include a new high school and renovation of two of the existing buildings.

The Andover Board of Education is beginning a search for a successor to Mr. Weibezahl, and plans to select a person by late February. An Acting Principal will be appointed until a permanent administrator is found.

Golden Age Club News

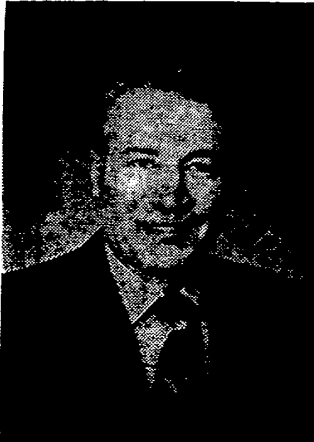
The Andover Golden Age Club met with the Wellsville group at the Congregational Church parlors for their second October meeting the 31st, with twenty-six members present from Andover.
