Immunization Clinic To Be Held At A.C.S. On Thursday, Nov. 29th

Allegheny County Public Health Nursing Service in cooperation with Andover School is sponsoring an immunization clinic at Andover Central School on November 29, 1973, at 1:30 p. m. Dr. Blaisdell will be in charge, assisted by Terry Ayers, Public Health Nurse, Agency Nurse, and Charity McCormick, R.N., School Nurse-Teacher.

State Law requires that all children enrolled in school must be immunized against Poliomyelitis, Measles (Regular and German) and Diphtheria. The Diphtheria is given in combination with Tetanus and Whooping Cough.

Parents of pre-school children wishing immunizations may attend this clinic, but please contact Charity McCormick, R.N., A.C.S. School Nurse, to make necessary arrangements.

1. Thermostats set at 68 degrees F.
2. Boiler pressure reduced from 7 lbs. to 5 lbs.
3. Special notices in each room directing that lights be turned off when not in use.
4. Corridor lighting reduced.
5. Christmas decorations will be used — with no lighting.
