FLAG — VETERANS BURIAL — A flag of the United States will be furnished by the VA to drape the casket of a deceased veteran discharged under other than dishonorable conditions who: (a) Had wartime service, or; (b) Had Mexican Border Service, January 1. 1911 to April 5, 1917, or (c) If peacetime served at least one enlistment, or (d) Was released from active service because of disability incurred in or aggravated in line of duty, or (e) Had service subsequent to January 31, 1955.

a mobile home under the GI Home Loan Program does not prevent a veteran from obtaining a mort-gage for a conventional home at a later date. The mobile home loan, however, must be paid in full be-fore the new mortgage can be granted.

Those Annual Income Questionnaires for veterans, their widows and dependent parents receiving non-service-connected pension, or dependency indemnity compensation. They should have arrived with the November first checks. And they still have to be completed and re-They should have arrived with the November first checks. With money hard to come by in most pensioners homes, this could mean a real hardship! So take the advice of State Director of Veterans' Affairs Frank N. Ragial Owners Warned Against "Mixing" Tires

If you are putting snow tires on a car equipped with radial tires, you should get radial snow tires, the Tire Industry Safety Council reminded motorists

reminded motorists

"The driving characteristics of radial tires are so different it is actually dangerous to have radials on the front wheels and bias ply or bias-belted tires on the rear wheels," said Council Chairman Malcolm R. Lovell, Jr. "It might be compared to having a rubber-soled shoe on one foot and a leather-soled shoe on the other."

In support of liss warning the

In support of its warning, the Council cited a new public advisory from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration on snow tires.

"If your car is equipped with radial ply tires, it is essential that radial ply constructed snow treads be purchased".

"Many motorist consider radial tires to be equal in traction to snow tires in snow or icy conditions," the advisory added. "However, most shates do not recognize radial ply tires as snow tires. When the motorist has doubts, he should check with his State, county of city jurisdiction."

they immediately assume the new direction. If the snow tires on the rear are of a different type, the trisk of slipping and causing a skid is increased.
