Dec. 22, 1973 — The Volunteer Firemen were called to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Fletcher and daughter, Janie, at 9:30 Wednesday night. The one story frame house is just off Route 17 about five miles east of Greenwood. The men responded with a tanker and pumper.
