Jan. 6, 1974 - Gary J. Moore of Binghamton, has accepted the position of Supervising Principal of the Greenwood Central School District and will begin his duties February 1. He will fill the position vacated by the resignation of Charles Wright which was effective December 31. In the interim period, Vice Principal Raymond Duke is acting Principal and Mr. Wright is employed by the District on a consultant basis, working about one or two hours each school day.

Mr. Moore is a graduate of Coudersport, Pa., High School and attended Texas A and M University. He graduated in 1961 from Mansfield, Pa., State College. He received his Master's degree from the New York State University College in Cortland, and has done advanced graduate work at Marywood College at Scranton, Pa., and Syracuse University. He is certified as elementary teacher, special education teacher, elementary principal and school district administrator. Mr. Moore is currently instruction supervisor of special education with the Broome-Tioga Board of Cooperative Educational Services and has been with the BOCES unit for the past eight years.

In 1967 he was teaching principal at Silver Lake School at Brackney, Pa., and from 1962-66 was special education teacher in the Binghamton City School District. He served three years with the U. S. Air Force. Mr. Moore's wife, Janice, is a certified home economics and elementary teacher. The couple have five children.

Mr. Moore is a member of the Parish Council of St. Andrews Church and President of Brookside School Parent-Teacher Association. He has served on the Board of Education of the Susquehanna School District, as Vice President of the Binghamton Teachers Association and Vice Chairman of the Binghamton Council of Boy Scouts. In 1972 he was a member of the Advisory Council for Masters Degree Program of the State University at Binghamton. Moore was selected for the position by the Greenwood Board of Education from a field of 78 candidates.
