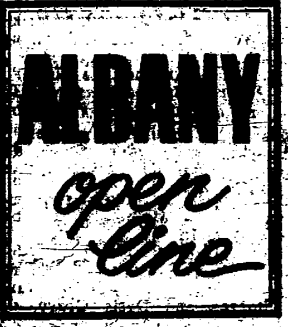

As Wilson spoke, five Assembly men, including Duryea, sat under indictment. Duryea and his chief lieutenant, Republican Assembly Majority Leader John Kingston, and another assemblyman are accused of election law violations.

Another Assemblyman, Democrat Calvin Williams of Brooklyn, is accused of bribery in connection with the arrest of his son and Armando Montano of the Bronx, who runs on the Republican, Democratic and Liberal lines, has been under indictment for more than a year on charges of incitement to riot.

Wilson also called for moving the primary date up from June to September as further discouragement to anyone interested in challenging him for the GOP nomination for governor this year. That bill will surely wind up in some Assembly waste basket.

Other items Wilson called for include:
Raising the welfare level from \$231 to \$258 a month for a family of four.
Setting up a daily lottery.

Spend, in the wake of the defeat last year of the \$3.5 billion mass transit bond issue, \$500 million to preserve the 35 cent fare in New York City and provide operating aid to upstate public transportation authorities.

Eliminate for one year the up to eight cents a pack tax on cigarettes imposed by New York City in an attempt to stop cigarette bootlegging now going on to avoid the tax. City residents pay that tax - four cents plus from one to four cents more depending on the tar and nicotine contents of the cigarettes, in addition to the 15 cents a pack imposed by the state.

But state residents will pay for it. Wilson wants to give the city the \$50 million in revenues it will lose by dropping the city tax.

Increase the various types of unemployment insurance & workmen's compensation payments by about \$20 a week.

In summary, much of the legislation has the old Rockefeller flavor. Nothing in the message was said about lowering taxes, a subject Wilson's aides said would be discussed when the budget is presented near the end of this month.
