Well I'm back with the results of my smoking survey. National Education Week on Smoking brought the public many facts on smoking, but I believe it should have emphasized the number of young adults who smoke and why they smoke. Perhaps, if they publicize these numbers more often, it will decrease the per capita consumption in a year.

My survey at A.C.S. high school resulted in some very interesting facts. The survey involved 105 students in grades nine through twelve. In these grades 62% are non-smokers for various reasons. Two reasons which appeared the most were the common one, "It will impair my health," and surprisingly "Cigarettes are too expensive."

However, what will happen when the student can afford "luxuries" such as cigarettes? Out of those students 38% were smokers for reasons such as, "It relaxes me," "I felt like smoking," and "It made me look cool." One reason is humorous and perhaps sensible too for not smoking was, "I eat suckers instead." Good idea?

A note I received on one survey was very truthful and perhaps one to think about. I want to share it with you. Quote: "The first three years I smoked was because I wanted to be with the crowd. Mainly to act 'big'. I'm a very nervous person - it calms me down. That's my excuse. Right now I'm in the process of quitting because it is being very unfair to the people I love and the people that love me. Besides the end results (cancer, etc.), your loved ones care and worry about you. Since this is important to me, I've promised myself that I wouldn't use smoking to calm myself down. After all, taking a deep breath of clean air helps you relax much better than taking a deep breath of tar and nicotine. Nicotine is very addictive; you get the shakes and you get sick. But I've decided (quitting) is worth it." Unquote. This is from a student who has been there and decided it wasn't right. Too bad more people don't feel the same way.

Local Law No. 1 of 1974

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Local Law No. 1 of 1974 which became effective January 14, 1974, is published pursuant to Section 214 (2) of the County Law:

A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS AND THE PER DIEM RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR CORONERS

Be It ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:

SECTION 1. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the County Judge shall be the sum of Thirty-One Thousand Dollars (\$31,000.00).

SECTION 2. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the Commissioner of Social Services shall be the sum of Fifteen Thousand One Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$15,180.00).

SECTION 3. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the Director of Planning shall be the sum of Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$14,500.00).

SECTION 4. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the County Superintendent of Highways shall be the sum of Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$14,500.00).

SECTION 5. Commencing January 1, 1974 the compensation for County Coroners shall be at the rate of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) per diem in the performance of their official duties.

SECTION 6. This local law shall take effect on the date it is filed in the office of the secretary of state.
