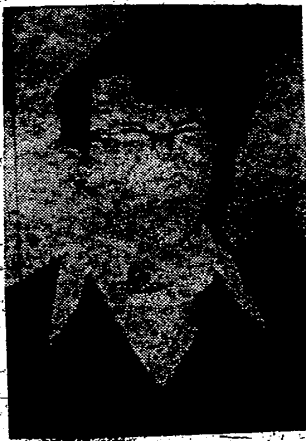

David Haugh Receives Bausch and Lomb Award

David Haugh, the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Haugh, is the recipient of the Annual Bausch and Lomb Science Award. The Bausch and Lomb Science Award is especially significant because it recognizes the senior with the highest scholastic standing in science subjects.

As winner of the award, Dave is eligible to compete for a four-year Bausch and Lomb Science Scholarship at the University of Rochester, Rochester, New York. Scholarship winners are selected on merit. Stipends are based on need and many range up to \$3,000 per year.
The science Award, a handsome bronze medal, is presented to winners at more than 3600 participating schools throughout the United States. Surveys indicate that the Award has encouraged more than thirty present of the winners to follow scientific careers.

Many of Dave's activities have centered around sports and music. He has been active in not only soccer, track, cross country and basketball, but also band. He is a member of Varsity Club and Camera Club. Dave will be pursuing a career in forestry.

Local Law No. 1 of 1974

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Local Law No. 1 of 1974 which became effective January 14, 1974, is published pursuant to Section 214 (2) of the County Law. A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF CERTAIN COUNTY OFFICERS AND THE PER DIEM RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR CORONERS

Be IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany as follows:

SECTION 1. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the County Judge shall be the sum of Thirty-One Thousand Dollars (\$31,000.00).

SECTION 2. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the Commissioner of Social Services shall be the sum of Fifteen Thousand One Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$15,180.00).

SECTION 3. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the Director of Planning shall be the sum of Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$14,500.00).

SECTION 4. Commencing January 1, 1974 the annual salary of the County Superintendent of Highways shall be the sum of Fourteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$14,500.00).

SECTION 5. Commencing January 1, 1974 the compensation for County Coroners shall be at the rate of Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) per diem in the performance of their official duties.

SECTION 6. This local law shall take effect on the date it is filed in the office of the secretary of state.
