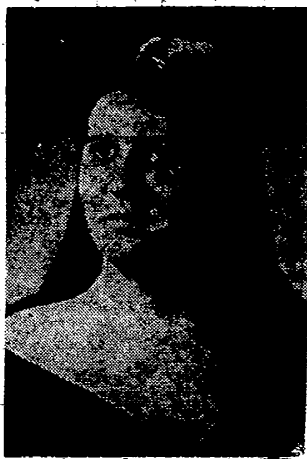
Scott Hazzard, cousin of the bride from Riverview Heights Wellsville, N. Y., was ringbearer.

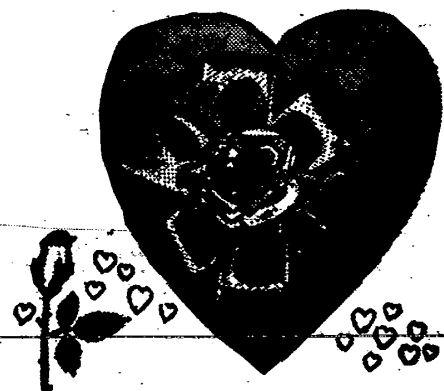
