Refresher Nursing Course Offered By Ag-Tech

Alfred and Olean are twin sites of a "refresher" nursing course to be offered soon by the State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred.

The course, first in a series, is designed primarily for persons in health-related professions who have been away from formal education for some time and wish to update their knowledge, according to Professor A. Donald Insley.

chairman of the college's Nursing Department.

"We will refresh their memory and in some cases perhaps provide a new base of understanding in nursing care," said Professor Insley. "Our hope is that when those completing the course go back to patient care, they will have a broader understanding of what health problems the patient has."

Offered through the Office for Continuing Education, the course will be taught evenings on both the Alfred campus and at the college's Cattaraugus County Extension facility in Olean. Hours are 7 p. m. to 10 p. m.

Classes are scheduled every two weeks, with the Alfred sessions starting March 11 and ending May 20 and Olean area classes starting March 18 and ending May 27. Enrollment is limited to 25 for each location.

The course is titled "Nursing Implications Related to Pathophysiology of Illness."

Professor Insley explains that "pathophysiology" refers to "alterations from normal." Class sessions will examine normal functions, compare these with alterations from normal, and then consider what can be done to alleviate or modify alterations.

Class instructors will be Professor Insley, Elizabeth Dixon, a registered pharmacist who is a guest lecturer at Alfred State College, and Barbara Friend, clinical instructor in the Nursing Department.

Tuition, registration, and a course syllabus are included in the \$35.15 cost of the program which carries three Continuing Education units of credit. Further information is available by contacting Professor Insley or Reed D. Lowrey, Director of Continuing Education at Alfred State College.
