Local Law No. 3**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the following Local Law No. 3 of 1974 which became effective February 25 1974, is published pursuant to Section 214 (2) of the County Law:

A local law providing for a special election on a proposition for the approval of Allegany county local law intro. no. 4-73, print no. 1, entitled "A local law authorizing the county of Allegany to join the Western regional off-track betting corporation"

Be it enacted by the board of legislators of the county of Allegany as follows:

Section 1. The board of legislators of the county of Allegany shall cause to be submitted at a special county election held not less than sixty days after the adoption of this local law, the date for which special election shall be fixed by resolution of said board of legislators, the following proposition:

"Shall Allegany county local law intro. no. 4-73, print no. 1, entitled 'A local law authorizing the county of Allegany to join the Western regional off-track betting corporation', be approved?"

§ 2. This local law shall take effect immediately.
