

Village Board Holds Special Meeting

Review Of Budget Estimate

The Village Board of Trustees held a Special Meeting March 18, 1974 at the Village Office for Review of Budget Estimate. Present: James Bliss, Mayor; Michael Brace, Avery Mead and William Dunham, Trustees.

The meeting was opened by Mayor Bliss.

After review, Michael Brace moved, seconded by Avery Mead, that the tentative budget, for the year ending May 31, 1975, be set at the following amounts:

General \$81,501.00
Water 13,425.00
Electric 68,578.00

and a tentative tax rate of \$30.00 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation be set to raise the amount of \$41,251.00 for the General Fund. Also a public hearing to be held on April 11, 1974 in the Village Office, between the hours of 7 P. M. and 8 P. M. to make a final review of the tentative budget. Carried

Moved by Michael Brace and seconded by William Dunham, to extend the date for bid opening on the sub station, for two weeks. The Board will meet at 7:30 on April 16th to open the bids. Carried

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by William Dunham, to purchase a new typewriter from Masons of Almond, for the Village Office. Carried

Moved by William Dunham and seconded by Avery Mead, to accept the bids of Pfuntner's for a new 1975 Police Car at the bid price of \$2,024.20. Carried

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by William Dunham to transfer \$2500.00 from account No. E9514 to No. 5110.1. Carried

Moved by William Dunham and seconded by Michael Brace to transfer \$2000.00 from account No. 8514 to account No. 1920.46. Carried

Moved by Michael Brace and seconded by Avery Mead, to transfer \$253.75 from account No. E6320.1 to No. E1620.0. Carried

Moved by William Dunham and seconded by Michael Brace to transfer \$81.74 from account No. F9710.6 to No. F1920.5. Carried

Moved by Avery Mead and seconded by Michael Brace, to transfer \$624.00 from account No. A9010.0 to account No. A1620.4. Carried

Moved by William Dunham and seconded by Avery Mead, to appoint Daniel R. Howe as Police Officer, with an 8 week probationary period and certain conditions to be stated by the Board. Carried

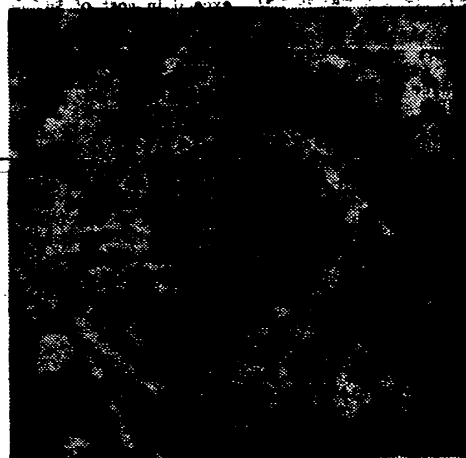
