Michael Brace moved, seconded by Paul Hyland, that the Andover News be designated as Official Newspaper. Carried.

Paul Hyland moved, seconded by Avery Mead, that the Citizens National Bank & Trust Co., Andover Branch, be designated as the Official Depository. Carried.

Michael Brace moved, seconded by Avery Mead, that the Clerk be authorized to pay for contract charges, payrolls and invoices bearing a discount, coming due before date of audit. Carried.

Michael Brace moved, seconded by Paul Hyland, that any Village Official wishing to attend the Spring Meeting of Allegany County Village Officers Assn., be authorized to attend with expenses to be paid from the General Fund.
