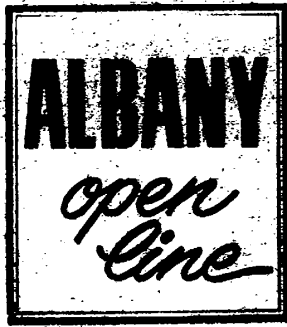

A special citizens committee has put the entire Legislature and the governor on the spot this election year.

The group made a study of the state's election campaign laws and then came up with a set of proposals that if enacted into law would make New York's campaign financing laws the toughest in the nation.

They told the Legislature and Gov. Wilson that such laws should be enacted in time to control this year's primary and general elections.

The proposals include restricting candidates to spending 50 cents per voter in campaigns, close the swiss-cheese loopholes in the law that allow candidates to conceal the amount they actually collected and spent, and limit campaign giving to \$50,000 a year per person and organization. Any they set up an independent commission with wide powers to control campaigns.

On the subject of elections, figures just released from the office of acting Secretary of State John J. Ghezzi show that 3,875,571 Democrats and 3,007,575 Republicans are eligible to vote in the September primaries. Enrollment figures also show a total of 134,432 Conservatives and 136,867 Liberal party members.

Of that total, New York City is 2,180,466 Democrats, 567,990 Republicans, 55,021 Conservatives and 77,217 Liberals.

The figures show a drop in overall enrollment — down some 400,000 voters in the Democratic party and about 200,000 in the Republican party.

Conservatives dropped about 13,000 in registration and Liberals by about 22,000, according to Ghezzi's figures.

The State Court of Appeals the other day put the cities of Buffalo, Yonkers, Rochester and Albany and a large number of school districts in a real bind the other day when they threw out a 1969 law that allowed them to exceed the constitutional limit on local real estate taxes to pay for pension and other retirement fund costs.

Buffalo, for example, will either have to trim about \$37 million from their's or find some other way to raise the money. For Rochester it would mean cutting their \$90 million budget by one third.

Cities such as Syracuse escaped because their legislators were farsighted enough to see what was coming and refused to have their cities included in the 1969 legislation.
