Alfred Educators To Present Paper in New Orleans

A paper co-authored by two Alfred educators will be presented April 10 in New Orleans, La., at the annual convention of the American Personnel and Guidance Association.

The paper is by James Bliss, assistant professor of psychology at State University Agricultural and Technical College at Alfred, and Dr. Stuart E. Smith professor of education at Alfred University. It will be presented by Professor Bliss.

Titled "MVII Scores for Two-Year College Students in Four Technical Curriculums," the paper is based on five years research involving students at the Wellsville Vocational Division of Alfred State College. "MVII" refers to the Minnesota-Vocational Interest Inventory tests which were administered to students in automotive, construction, electrical, and food service curriculums.

Professor Bliss said results of the study indicate that MVII can be very useful in helping high school students and graduates to make occupational choices in skilled trades areas.

Some 8,000 persons are expected to attend the APGA convention this year.

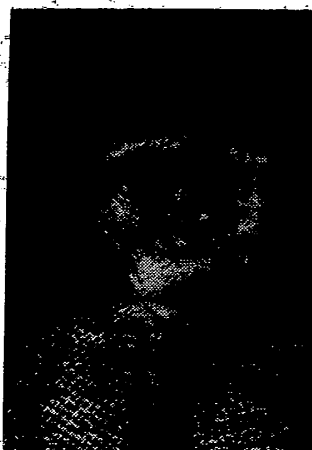
