School Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Andover Central School was called to order Monday evening, April 8, by the President, Mr. William Walker. The following Board members were present: Dr. Walker, Mr. Atwell, Mr. Stephens, Mr. Horan and Mrs. Slade. Interim Principal Mr. Howard Mosher and the new District Principal — Mr. Curville Jordan were also present.

The minutes of the previous meetings were read for approval. Mr. Horan made the motion to accept these as read and Mr. Atwell seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The Treasurer's Report was read for approval and comparison. Mrs. Slade made the motion that these be accepted as read. Seconded by Mr. Horan and passed by 5 votes of yes.

A motion was made by Mr. Horan and seconded by Mr. Atwell that the interest on Certificates of Deposits be deposited in another Certificate of Deposit for each. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

General Fund bills for March 1974 for \$4,760.62 were presented for approval. Mrs. Slade made the motion that these be approved for payment and Mr. Horan seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

School Lunch bills for \$1,949.25 were presented for payment. Mr. Horan made the motion and Mr. Atwell seconded that these be paid. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Title I bills for \$49.36 were presented for payment. Mrs. Slade made the motion and seconded by Mr. Atwell. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The Cafeteria report was read showing a net profit of \$2,306.67 for the month of March. A motion was made by Mr. Horan and seconded by Mrs. Slade that this report be filed with the minutes. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

The Gross Payrolls were read for approval of the Board. The total of these was \$42,131.14. Mr. Atwell made the motion, seconded by

Mr. Horan. Passed by 5 votes of yes.
 Interest payment is due on April 14th for \$51.51 on Bus No. 27. Mrs. Slade made the motion that this be paid. Mr. Horan seconded the motion. Passed by 5 votes of yes.

Resolution was passed by the Board that Mrs. Kelley re-open our Bank Savings Account. Mr. Stephens moved, Mr. Atwell seconded. Carried by 5 yes votes.

The school has received the money from Hartford Insurance Company for the water damage done to the two offices and Principal's office. This has been put in a revenue account — Insurance Recoveries — which will offset the amounts that have already been spent to replace items water damaged and charged to subsidiary accounts in our appropriations.

The final meeting has been held between Mrs. Kelley and the New York representative of the Health, Education and Welfare — Disaster Dept. — Mr. Parry. He informs us that Mrs. Kelley's records are in order and satisfactory claims have been made by us. We will receive our check for full restitution — excepting the amounts listed. We will have received a total of \$60,847.40. This money should be received by us within four weeks.

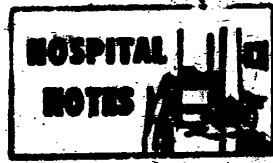
The Board officially commends Mrs. Kelley for the excellent manner in which she has discharged her duties in this particular responsibility.

Motion was made by Mr. Horan and seconded by Mr. Stephens, that the President be authorized to borrow an additional \$5,000.00. This amount is to be borrowed "in case of need only."

All bus bids were rejected. The Board will re-advertise for bids. The ceiling on bus prices will have to be raised \$500 to be more compatible with today's prices. Mr. Horan moved, Mr. Stephens seconded. Motion was carried by 5 yes votes.

Resignation of Al Barden as Superintendent of Plant and Grounds was accepted — effective 6/30/74. Mr. Horan made the motion to accept — with regret Mr. Atwell seconded. Motion was carried by 5 yes votes.
