**Stanley Kelleher**  
 Stanley Kelleher, 25 of Railroad Ave., Scio, died Sunday, April 14, 1974 at Olean General Hospital from injuries sustained Thursday in a car-train accident in Scio.

Mr. Kelleher was the driver of a car hit by an Erie-Lackawanna freight train at the Knights Creek crossing in Scio at about 1:30 p. m. Thursday.

A passenger in the car, Kenneth L. Baldwin of Little Genesee, was killed instantly at the scene of the accident.

Mr. Kelleher was taken to Jones Memorial Hospital and was later transferred to Olean General Hospital where he remained in critical condition in the intensive care unit until his death. He had sustained multiple fractures and internal injuries.

He was born in Hornell, December 15, 1948 a son of Stanley and Frances Davis Kelleher. He had lived in Wellsville, Andover, and Alfred Station prior to moving to Scio five months ago.

Mr. Kelleher was employed by Dresser Clark Company of Olean. He was a member of the Scio Church of Christ.

Survivors include his wife, the former Susan Fuller, whom he

married March 7, 1970; one son, Shawn at home; his mother, Mrs. Frances Weitzel of Andover; three sisters, Mrs. Sharon Pool of Anabelton, Texas, Mrs. Jane Holdsworth of Rochester, and Miss Deborah Kelleher of Andover; seven brothers, Gary of Wellsville, James of Honeoye, Stephen of Helmut, David, Richard and Douglas, all of Andover, William of Ft. Belvoir, Va.; and several nieces and nephews.

Friends were received at the James Mulholland Funeral Home in Andover, where funeral services were conducted at 2 p. m. Tuesday with the Rev. Enos P. Nay, pastor of the Scio Church of Christ officiating.

Burial was in the Rural Cemetery in Hornell.
