

Holland Has New Sound of Speed

Something new and revolutionary was unveiled at Holland International Speedway at the practice session on Sunday, April 21st. All race cars are now equipped with noise abatement devices. Although the silencers are not as restrictive as highway mufflers, yet much of the shrill sound has now been put into the history books. The practice session turned out many competitors in all divisions.

Dick Flaig of Eggertsville amazed the over 2,000 spectators attending practice day by setting the fast time in a brand new car. The car Flaig campaigned during the 1973 Season was run by Roger Kelly of Perry with the third fastest time. Surprise performance were turned in by Gail Barber of Bliss New York in his Rookie year in the Late Model Sportsman Division who turned in the second fastest time. Rounding out the top six were 1973 Late Model Sportsman, Art Clark of West Seneca, Warren (Butch) Holtz of East Aurora and Bob Starke of Buffalo.

The Limited Sportsman Division which features the modified look showed many new entries with veteran John Carpenter leading the way both in time trials and the 10 lap qualifying heat. The Charger Division appears to be a toss up with Champion Gail Barber moving into the Late Model Sportsman Division. Early favorites include Greg Heimenz of Orchard Park and Jerry Riehle of West Seneca.

Racing will continue each Saturday night with the new starting time of 7:30 p. m. This new starting time maximizes the use of daylight, thereby conserving energy.

Veterans News

Severely disabled veterans were advised today by James J. McLaughlin, State Veteran Counselor, that they may be entitled to free use of public campsites and parks within the State.

The counselor explained that severely disabled veterans who are residents of New York State, who have received an award from the Federal Government toward the purchase of a specially equipped automobile are entitled, along with their families to free use of public campsites and parks within the state.

Admission to these areas by the severely-disabled veterans may be obtained by presenting, at campsites and park entrances their exempt New York State Motor Vehicle registration certificate or certification from the United States Veterans Administration that the veteran was awarded funds toward the purchase of an automobile.

Disabled veterans seeking detailed information on all veterans benefits are urged to contact the local counseling center of the New York State Division of Veterans Affairs located at the Municipal Bldg. Wellsville, N. Y., on Tuesdays, and at the City Building, 100 Broadway, Hornell, N. Y., on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

Hypertensive Screening Clinic May 8th

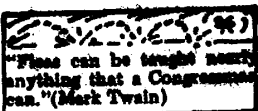

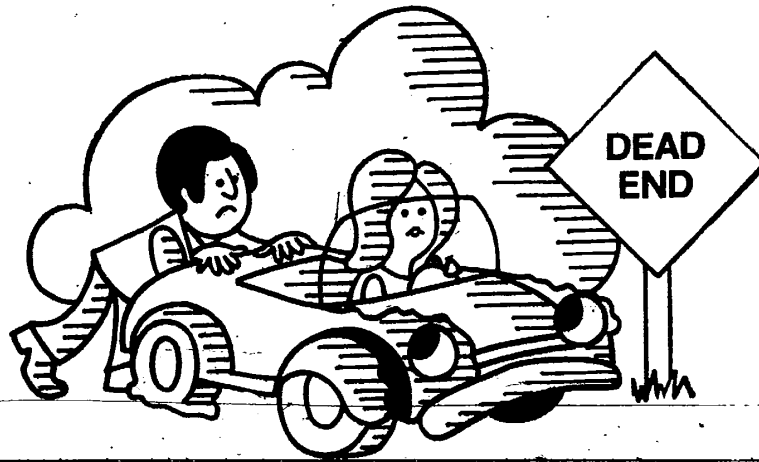
